HOPE, HEART & HOME recruits for 6 opportunities to support children in foster care:

(1) FOSTER PARENTS

Children entering foster care due to child abuse, neglect, or abandonment need quality foster families to provide safe, nurturing, and loving homes where they can thrive and feel they belong. These children need support, comfort, and guidance during this difficult time in their lives. Foster parenting can be a short or long term commitment. *Citrus* provides *CARE* classes for interested parents.

(2) RESPITE PARENTS

Foster parents often need "breaks" during their time caring for children. Respite Parents provide that break by temporarily caring for children in their homes for short periods of time. Anyone interested in becoming a respite parent completes the same *CARE* training with *Citrus* that full-time foster parents go through.

(3) GUARDIAN AD LITEM

These same children also need court-appointed *Guardian ad Litem (GAL)* to advocate for their best interests in dependency court procedures. Guardians make sure children are not lost in over-burdened legal and social service systems or languish in an inappropriate home or shelter. The *Guardians* require 30 hours of training, including on-line study and courtroom observation.

(4) MENTORS

Teenage children "age-out" of dependent care at age 18. Studies have shown that teens who connect with a volunteer mentor achieve better grades, achieve higher graduation rates, and find better jobs. HHH Mentors will assist high school and college students navigate their way through college entrance, curriculum, "life questions," and career paths. Extensive training and background checks required.

(5) PANELISTS

Florida Foster Care Review conducts review sessions of pending cases before the Children's Court. They interview, screen, and train panelists to serve on civilian review "roundtables." Panelists serve one full day a month.

(6) CAREPORTAL NETWORKING

HHH needs Child Advocates to volunteer to help meet the specific needs of local foster families posted on the CarePortal platform. Anyone from 19 to 90 can join!

HHH meets the second Monday of every month.



Nelson Hincapie Named New Executive Director of Miami Dade College Foundation

Miami, Jan. 18, 2022 – Nelson Hincapie, a proud Miami Dade College (MDC) alumnus, has been named the new executive director of the MDC Foundation, which raises essential private funds to support scholarships, academic programs and services to change the lives of MDC students, families and communities through the transformational opportunity of education.

Most recently, Hincapie served as President and CEO of *Voices for Children* Foundation, Inc., a nonprofit that provides financial assistance and resources to abused, abandoned and neglected children. During his time at Miami-Dade County, he led the successful statewide campaign for Universal Pre-K, which guarantees high-

quality pre-kindergarten education for every four-year-old child in Florida.

Hincapie serves *The Children's Trust* first appointed by Miami-Dade Mayor Carlos Gimenez and re-appointed by Mayor Daniella Levine Cava in 2020, where he currently serves on the Executive Committee and is Vice Chair of the Bylaws Ad-Hoc Committee. He has served as the Chair of the Community Based Organization Advisory Committee, created by Miami-Dade County Commissioners.

In 2018, Hincapie, along with *St. John Neumann* parishioner Eric Schwindeman, helped found a multi-parish outreach program to support children in foster care called *HOPE*, *HEART & HOME*. As the first such effort in the Archdiocese of Miami, their team started recruiting volunteers from three churches to become foster parents and Guardian ad Litem. Expanding to 11 parishes and now recruiting respite parents, mentors, panelists, and donors for a new platform called CarePortal, Hincapie encouraged *Hope*, *Heart & Home* to continue their efforts through the pandemic with virtual meetings and his leadership was instrumental in their success in the community.

Hincapie is an MDC alumnus and Kellogg Executive Scholar. He earned a bachelor's degree in public administration from Florida International University. Throughout his professional career, he has received numerous awards including the Florida Commendation Medal from the Florida National Guard in 2020.

Founded in 1965, the MDC Foundation raises essential private funds to support scholarships, academic programs and support services so MDC students have the opportunity to pursue their dreams. The MDC Foundation also supports world-class arts and cultural programming at MDC that enriches the community. Known as Democracy's College, MDC changes lives through accessible, high-quality teaching and learning experiences that prepare students for tomorrow's workforce. Community Service

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program

VITA volunteers assist with basic tax returns for individuals who are low-income, disabled, non-English speaking and elderly. If you are interested in participating in the VITA program, please email umhope@law.miami.edu to request a list of agency partners in the community. You may then reach out directly to the agency of your choice to request information about training and scheduling. Tax assistance takes place from late January through April.







A WIN for Miami-Dade and Monroe's Children and Families HHH Joins Effort to Preserve Service Levels

HOPE, HEART & HOME attended an emergency meeting of the CBC ALLIANCE
March 3 to address the potential budget "adjustments" by the Florida House for CITRUS FCN's services to children in foster care in Dade & Monroe counties. Maria Jacques and Eric Schwindeman joined the call with 78 other stakeholders. The Alliance heard an impassioned appeal from CITRUS Esther Jacobo and voted unanimously to oppose any cuts in the child welfare budget. The House and Senate conferences took up deliberations March 7.

HHH Child Advocates initiated a "write-in" campaign to House and Senate leaders. The following are sample excerpts from that effort:

"I urge you not to support the proposed budget cuts to Citrus Family Care Network. These cuts would be devastating to the many services and programs they offer."

"As a Guardian Ad Litem, I am representing the most vulnerable population of foster children in our community. Citrus works with the GAL program and provides ongoing support. Cutting their budget will affect not only the number of children a caseworker has to oversee but will affect the services offered to our community and ultimately the future of our neediest children. I urge you not to support the proposed budget cuts to Citrus Family Care Network. These cuts would be devastating to the many services and programs they offer."



"I write to ask you to <u>vote no</u> on the Florida House's budget proposal that would result in an annual cut of more than \$17 million for Citrus Family Care Network in Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties for adoption, prevention and foster care services."

"As an adoptive mother of two, I know how crucial support services are to adoptive parents. As a Guardian ad Litem to over 50 children, I have seen how difficult foster parenting can be and how much these foster parents need support and education. Last of all, all of us in the child welfare system can clearly see that prevention is the key, reducing support to that service would result in even more families needing services from a program that is already stretched to the max."

"Let's keep our children first, vote no for those who cannot vote, and show them that they matter to all of us."

On Tuesday, March 8, 2022 10:02 AM we got the good news!

"We have received notice that the Florida Legislature will NOT be cutting ANY funding from the Miami-Dade and Monroe child welfare system of care.

The Florida House put additional dollars into their final budget proposal to more adequately fund Lead Agencies around the state without making cuts to South Florida. This is a HUGE win for our local system of care, for the system of care statewide, and for Florida's children and families.

We are **SO GRATEFUL** to all of our partners and stakeholders. You all made your voices heard by sending thoughtful and passionate letters, emails, and messages to leaders in Tallahassee to express the devastating impact that a cut would have on our community. You made a difference!


