

HOUSE FIRE in Florida City DISPLACES FAMILY of 9 One hospitalized, 2 dogs killed



FLORIDA CITY, FLA. (January 5) - - An early morning fire in Florida City has left a family of nine and their pets displaced and claimed the lives of two of their dogs.

Miami-Dade Fire Rescue units responded to the scene of the blaze along the 800 block of Northwest 12th Street, just after 7:30 a.m., Thursday.

"Occupied house burning. Complainant is advising children are trapped inside the house," a 911 dispatcher told first responders.

Cellphone video captured firefighters outside the burning home as heavy smoke billowed into the air....



HHH's Mary Walton woke up to this story, Thursday morning, January 5. When she learned that the family of nine was in a DCF preventative program, she sprang into action. Single-handedly, Mary began to marshal all the community support from child welfare agencies, local government, churches, and faith-based non-profits. HOPE, HEART & HOME was proud to join a team that included the *American Red Cross, DCF, Citrus FCN, Share Your Heart, One More Child,* and *Safe Families* to support this family.

Mary led the way. Through her contacts, honed from her years as a Guardian ad Litem, she directed financial support to the family from the Mayor and Commissioner's offices, the hotel chain, the funeral home (the grandmother succumbed to smoke inhalation) and the HHH CarePortal Response Team. Mary even went live on **WSVN Channel 7** to appeal to the public for additional funds.


Generous donations from HHH volunteers enabled **Valerie Van Ostran** to deliver over \$1000.00 in gift cards to the family to purchase desperately needed food & clothing. After the family got settled in a rental property, **Maria Jacques** and **Lorenzo Cosio**, working with a team of teens under **Panos Kourtesis** (*One More Child*), took truckloads of case goods to Florida City to help furnish their empty home.

Many thanks to Mary Walton for her on-going care of this family. The parents expressed their deepest gratitude for all the incredible support they received from HHH.

child advocates attended this meeting!



Thirty-five *HOPE*, *HEART* & *HOME* Child Advocates heard a different perspective on the dependency system at their January 14 meetingthis time from an agency that represents the biological parents.

Attorney **Margaret Julien** from the Regional Counsel's Office and two Peer Parents, **Roxanna Llarena** & **Isis Gonzalez** articulated the parents' point of view and the challenges they face when a child is removed from a parent's custody. "We're human. too," Roxana pointed out. "Sometimes people just make stupid mistakes."

The system is designed to "re-unite families." HHH learned that for biological parents, that process is easier said than done. Thanks Margaret, Roxanna, and Isis for opening our eyes to their "trials and tribulations!"





HOPE, HEART & HOME Hears Inspirational Talk from Syndicated Radio Host AIMEE CABO



Child advocates, who joined the February 13 *HOPE*, *HEART & HOME* monthly virtual meeting, heard a powerful testament to honesty, love, and belief from a parishioner at *Our Lady of Lourdes* and radio talk show host, **AIMEE CABO**. At age 15, Aimee was part of what the Miami media dubbed "the case from hell" -a sexual abuse case that pitted her parents against Aimee and her sister. To this day, Aimee credits her faith in God and the love of her support network for helping her through surviving child abuse.

"Despite the hurt, the evil I've seen," Aimee told 30 HHH attendees, "I knew God was with me! That's why your work with teens {in foster care} is so important. God wants us to step out of our comfort zone - he just wants our best effort." She called for renewed "faith-based" fostering and mentoring efforts with teens aging out of foster care. "Kids need your love!" She and her family plan to foster a teen in 2023.


HOPE, *HEART & HOME* were invited Guest Speakers at the MorningStar Renewal Center's *Catholic Prayer Breakfast*, March 13. Over 40 attendees enjoyed an overview of the Ministry's operations and initiatives presented by a panel of HHH Child Advocates.

HHH's **Malvi Longoria** spoke for the six Guardian ad Litem at the meeting, outlining how typical child welfare cases work.

5 new HHH initiatives were also introduced to the audience:

1) Florida City Family Rescue - Mary Walton, ably assisted by Maria Jacques, Lorenzo Cosio, Valerie Van Ostran, and Panos Kourtesis of One More Child, described the delivery of 3 truckloads of furniture to a family who lost everything in a house fire on January 5. Mary thanked all

> the donors that allowed the family to move into their new home.



(3) Technical School **Scholarships - Lorenzo** Cosio unveiled the creation of \$10,000 of grants earmarked for foster teens who dream of a technical


school education. Brokered with HHH partners, LA6 Lucas Alvarez Foundation and Citrus Family Care Network, Lorenzo plans roll-out these scholarships for the 2023-2024 school year!

(4) Youth Soccer Referee Program - HHH's Lou **Confessore** (St. Catherine's & Coral Estates Soccer Club) and HHH's Pedro Vilallongo (Key Biscayne Club

> Site Director) have secured a \$10,000 grant from the **Miami**

Kiwanis and the creation of a referee training program for 60 high paid positions to our foster youth, aged 15-17. Partnering with Marta Torres (Licensing Director of Citrus FCN), this initiative has already attracted 18 applications.







(5) Random Acts of Kindness Campaign - piloted by HHH's Maria Jacques, announced a new phase of deliveries to our local foster families, commencing in April (*Child Abuse Prevention Month*). Families receive surprise visits from HHH volunteers with meals, toys, school supplies, and gift cards.

In February, **Rosie Perez-Lacayo** oversaw the delivery of 500 Valentine "Love Baskets" (prepared by *Holy Rosary – St. Richards* parishioners) to HHH partners, including **Citrus FCN**, **Casa Vallentina**, **St. Anne's**, **One More Child**, and **Genesis Hopeful Haven**.


