## RANDOM

Random Acts of Lindness was founded by St. John Neumann's Maria Jacques (HHH GAL) in 2022. By leveraging small donations from friends and family, she organized a team of volunteers to conduct monthly visits to foster families. During these visits, they delivered gift cards, meals, seasonal baskets, cookies and various small presents to families. The Random Acts program has been reorganized under the leadership of three seasoned HHH leaders:



Mary Walton, a former GAL manager and community activist, is

responsible for overseeing recruitment and delivery in southern Dade.



**Bernadett Horvath**, a peer parent and founder of BDW & More, a non-profit organization that distributes bottles, diapers, and wipes, is administering the program in northern Dade.

## HOPE, HEART & HOME HOSTS FFCR'S MARISSA LEICHTER

On April 14, Hope, Heart & Home Child Advocates received a detailed overview of the Florida Foster Care Review from their Senior Manager of Training and Engagement, Marissa Leichter.

Since 1989, Florida Foster Care Review (FFCR) has engaged community volunteers to improve safety, stability, and outcomes for children in foster care by connecting them to necessary services, relationships, and permanent families. Florida Foster Care Review's Citizen Review Panel (CRP) Program collaborates with trained volunteers to facilitate comprehensive review hearings for children in foster care and identify any unmet needs.







Through the CRP's recommended orders, FFCR seeks for children to receive services that contribute to their stability and well-being. Based at the Miami-Dade County Children's Courthouse, each of FFCR's 12 CRP panels meets virtually one day per month to conduct 5 to 8 review hearings.

FFCR's team of professionals trains and supports

volunteers, assesses program effectiveness, and develops new approaches to increase their impact on children.

## HHH GOES BOWLING!



The Buddy Bench Project has placed 6 benches in local schools and parks to support Mental Health and promote Bullying Protection.



### HHH CELEBRATES REUNIFICATION


June is reunification month in the child

#### Collaborative Programs Move Forward!

Hope Heart & Home Ministry wishes to recognize its 501(c)3 partner, Sadie's Daughter's Initiative (SDI), for the launch of three summer collaborative programs with twelve child welfare organizations.



SDI Director, Dr. Alecia Rodriguez, secured a Zee Grant from the Kiwanis Club of Miami, to provide coed basketball and flag football programs in Homestead for fifty children aged seven to eleven, including those from foster care and low socioeconomic backgrounds.

In collaboration with HHH, SDI also received funding from the National Christian Foundation and Explore Foster Miami to distribute gift cards to

teens aged seventeen to nineteen who are transitioning out of foster care. This "Give Back" assistance program is currently supporting applicants from His House, Genesis Hopeful Haven, First Star Academy, Citrus FCN, and Casa Valetina.

Additionally, a donation from **George Lopez** to SDI and **Lucas Alvarez LA6 Foundation** will be managed by HHH's **Bernadett Horvath**, **Mary Walton**, and **Leanna Roberts** to assist biological and foster families through the "Random Acts of Kindness" Campaign.


